Heavy rains early on flooded the allotments and either washed out or drowned early sowings, the following hot spell then baked the successive sowings, whilst the final cool Summer months delayed ripening of crops! Despite all this all three Shows we support were a great success.

At the Harrow in Leaf (HiL) August Bank Holiday Show held at the Harrow Museum & Tithe Barn, our members did us proud whilst as usual we did well in the inter-Society Championship – winning this once again. For the latter our thanks go to our Chris and John Salter who organise our entries in parallel with organising our own Show.

Our Show's new wonderful venue of Roxeth Community Church (RCC) was an instant hit last year with both competitors and visitors and this year proved an even greater attraction, so again we must again thank the RCC members for all their help and warm welcome they gave us. My annual mantra applies: yet again our Show was a spectacular success with about 300+ entries. And yet again it was accorded the highest praise by the judges, who asked (or should I say begged?) that our competitors entered the Middlesex County Show on the Sunday week. Such success does not happen by chance, so on your behalf I proffer our thanks to all involved - especially our Show secretary Chris Salter for her boundless energy and inspirational input.

The Show Committee would also wish to raise thanks to RCC members for all their invaluable help, interest, and support: we will return to RCC next year for our 2017 Show.

Finally, we also did well at the Middlesex County Show in Perivale, the Society again doing well in the inter-Society Award coming runner up to Harefield horticultural society (£15 to our coffers!). Although smaller than our Show it does attract some exemplary exhibits and as such next year, given the judges high praise for our Show, it would be nice to see some more of our members enter their wonderful exhibits to show a wider audience.

Trading Shed News

At the time of writing the Trading Shed looks very empty and we are completely out of horse manure but the Shed will be restocked fully in time for the major selling period in Spring and early Summer with all your favourite multi- purpose composts etc.

Shakespeare Autumn onion sets which can be planted now are available but are selling fast– so pop along and get yours before they all go.

However my main message at this time of the year is to come early in the New Year to buy your seed potatoes, onions and shallots, as because of rather poor sales I have not ordered so many as last year as the Society really cannot afford to lose money on seed potatoes if they are not sold.

Varieties ordered for 2016 are First Earlies – Pentland Javelin, Swift and Red Duke of York – Second Earlies - Charlotte and Kestrel – Main Crop -Desiree, King Edward, and Cara . As usual I have selected new variety which this year is Pentland Javelin and despite Brexit the price should be the same as last year.

As far as onions are concerned I have ordered the usual firm favourite varieties – Sturon and Golden Gourmet shallots, again they should be on sale early in the New Year.

These potatoes and onions will, hopefully, be on sale from Sunday 15th January 2017 so the advice is to come early to ensure you get the variety you want.
