

Please Do Attend. This is your Society so do come along and see how we have performed over the past year. Think we could do better? Great! We always welcome suggestions upon how we can improve.

**APPEAL.** Given the loss of four stalwarts last year we are desperately low on both Committee Members and Shed helpers. Please do consider standing for the Committee - 6 meetings a year - or volunteering to help down the Shed - its only one Sunday in five - as without either we will cease trading. We need your help, fresh ideas, and above all your support. So do come along and tell us what you think.

**MARKET RESEARCH: POTATOES, ONIONS, & SHALLOTS:** Just checked out our local Homebase and it only reinforces our claim to be the cheapest and the best. Remember all ours are sold pro rata by weight, hence you have the convenience of buying precisely the number of spuds/onions/shallots that you want to plant.

**ONIONS & SHALLOTS:** Homebase sell their onions in £2.50 bags of 50 and shallots in £2.50 bags of 10. All ours are at the rate of £2.40 per Kg giving 50 onions at c. 72p, and 10 shallots 96p.

**POTATOES :** Homebase "Earlies (e.g. "Swift") are sold in £1.50 nets of 5, and 2nds/mains spuds in 1.5Kg bags at £3 each (i.e.£2 per Kg). All ours spuds are pro rata at £1.70 Kg. Hence 5 of our "Swift" potatoes cost around 80p (not £1.50!), whilst 1.5kg of 2nds/mains would cost only £2.55. Additionally you only need buy the number you want, so you can buy say 60 onions whereas at Homebase you would be forced to buy 100. Similarly with us you can buy 2kgs of spuds and pay for 2Kgs. whereas at Home base you would have to buy 3Kg!



**NOTICEBOARDS:** As I persistently emphasise, you do need to regularly check our noticeboards. Remember they are our quickest way of updating you. They will inform you of our latest offers and news of what is going on throughout the year besides giving monthly gardening tips, action lists and other topical news.

### Show Report Our Show 2018 – Christine Salter

As soon as we have caught our breath from last year's Show, planning for the next Autumn Show starts. The hall and Judges are booked and the new Show Schedule is compiled with a few changes to reflect comments received and some updates to give regular exhibitors new challenges. In the Handicraft Classes the photograph classes feature "A Woodland Scene" and "Rain", so the latter may have some interesting interpretations. Full details are in this year's Show Schedule which will be available at the Trading Shed or on-line.

I was really heartened last year with the number of new exhibitors. A local Society show such as ours is ideal for anyone new, willing to have a go at exhibiting. We do try to encourage this by having plenty of novice classes. These are designed to be encouraging rather than demanding and ideal for anyone starting out and wanting to try something new. Everything for your growing needs should be at the shed along with lots of help and advice.

The Show Committee have done their bit so it is now up to you. With no exhibits there will be no show for anyone! So, you can start planning too and there are really are no excuses for all to have a go at something. In the meantime, I do hope that whatever you are growing or making this year turns out to be successful and if it is something special we don't want to hear about it – we want you to share it with everyone at our **Show on 1st September**.

### **Trading Shed Report**

For anyone who has been to the Trading Shed recently they will be aware that we are nearly out of some bulk goods, apart from large multipurpose, but never fear the Shed will be fully stocked in time for the major planting and growing season. If you are not yet a member of my Loading Crew and would like to help when the bulk delivery arrives please let me, or a Shed Helper, have your name and phone number and I will get in touch when the delivery is expected.

Seed potatoes, onions and shallots are now in stock and selling well so come along to make sure you get the varieties you want. Potato varieties are –first earlies - Arran Pilot and Swift: second earlies - Charlotte and Kestrel and main crop – Desiree, King Edward and Cara. Onions are Sturon and Shallots are Golden Gourmet both old favourites.

Dahlias and gladioli have just been ordered and should be on sale very soon.

I would now like to turn to flower, vegetable and green manure seeds. Last year I had a large selection of all these seeds and, to be honest, some of them did not sell at all well and a lot of them, especially green manures are now out of date. They are now being offered at half price and they can be found on a table in the far end of the shed. Following these poor sales in 2017 I have reduced the varieties for 2018 but hope there will be something to take your fancy. On the subject of green manures I will not be buying any this year but if any members would like some I will order them for them but the minimum order will be 5 packets. This measure is to try to reduce the loss the Society made in 2017.
